



This photo shows Mount Pleasant in about 1909 and is looking south from Devlin's corner.

The first home in the foreground with the picket-fence was the house of John Randall Ellis. Next door is the John Randall Ellis shop. He was a cabinet maker. This was also at one time the site of the village post office and several earlier businesses.

The third building stands on the site of the present-day community centre and fire hall. In this photo it is a hotel. It later became the Litehouse Restaurant which eventually burned down. An earlier hotel on this site might have been a stagecoach stop.

Beyond the hotel is Mount Pleasant Presbyterian Church.

The home in the far distance belonged to Dr. Walter Phelps, a dentist.
