These conversations helped Moses to wholeheartedly rely on God's wisdom and direction as he guided the Israelites through the wilderness toward the Promised Land. Jesus reminded us that we have been given this same privilege to be friends with Him.

I no longer call you slaves, because a master doesn't confide in his slaves. Now you are my friends, since I have told you everything the Father has told me. (John 15:15)

Even though Jesus is our Lord and Master, He chooses to call us His friends. Jesus made the first step in choosing us to be His friends and leaves it up to us to accept His invitation. We can have friends who are part of our lives just for a certain season, others who we have lost touch with and reconnected with after a period of time, and still others who remain a constant. Jesus' friendship with us is a constant as revealed in the Great Commission: "I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

While Jesus' friendship toward us is a constant, perhaps we have allowed our relationship toward Him to wander and drift off. If this is the case, let's take this season of "RRROLL UP 2 WIN" to *reconnect with our dear friend and Saviour, Jesus*. Grab a coffee and talk with Him just like we would with a friend.
